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Promoting Innovation, Social Entrepreneurship and Community Problem-Solving

Mei San developed the Innovation Curriculum incorporating innovation, social entrepreneurship and community problem-solving, as part of the school's Applied Learning Programme. A national innovation fair cum competition was organised as a platform to showcase students' innovative projects to the public and promote the spirit of innovation to others in the education fraternity. This competition cum fair is open to upper primary and lower secondary students.

Mei San leads in the planning and design of the whole school curriculum in innovation. As part of talent management for students, she leads a team of staff to steer a selected group of students to look deeper into innovation. They have partnered external organisations, such as St Luke's Eldercare, PCF, Lions Befrienders and Fernvale Gardens School, to level up the innovation culture in the school and fraternity.



IMPACT

Students were better able to crystallise and express their thoughts about the implications of their actions, especially the effect on others. There has been a decrease in the number of discipline cases. It is also observed that students are better able to empathise and take the perspective of others. This programme has also strengthened teachers' competencies in teaching Character and Citizenship Education.
