## **Areas of Practice**

The six prioritised Areas of Practice in SFEd are: Assessment Literacy, Differentiated Instruction, Inquiry-Based Learning, E-pedagogy, Character and Citizenship Education, and Support for Students with Special Educational Needs. A brief description of these six prioritised Areas of Practice, the rationale for prioritising them, and the implications on teaching practices are provided in <u>Table 1</u>.
